

In the Spotlight

Paul Starke - 58 year member

Paul is a delightful gentleman who has been a member of the Loyal

Order of Moose for over 58 years. He is a member of Columbia Lodge #126 and has many, many stories to tell of the history of this Lodge as well as the history of the Moose.

Columbia Lodge was known as NW Washington

Lodge in 1952 and was housed in a three story brick house which is now apartments for students at Georgetown University. The Lodge eventually moved to Columbia, MD and the new lodge was dedicated in 1982 on Brandywine Road. Frank Buckler, from College Park Lodge, was the Supreme Governor at the time and was present at the dedication.

Paul advised that Harry Truman and Franklin Delano Roosevelt were both members of the Moose with their membership at the NW Washington Lodge. NW Washington Lodge was instituted on June 15, 1909 and it would be assumed had quite a few politicians as members throughout its years.

As a Life Member of the Moose, Paul has served in many capacities at Columbia Lodge and in the Moose Fraternity. He was on the Executive Board for 6 years, served as Administrator for 7 years, was the President of the 1st District, Past President of the Moose Legion, a Moose Legionnaire in Maryland, and was voted twice as Moose of the Year.

Paul earned his Fellowship Degree of Honor in 1966 and stated that at that time there wasn't a blue coat, the men wore a ribbon across their chests to show they were Fellows. In 1992 or 1993, Paul was called to the House of God at Mooseheart to received

the Pilgrim Degree of Merit. He is 88 years old and has a mind as sharp as a tack.

This Historian of the Moose advised that, originally, the Governor was called the Dictator. He also states that Columbia Lodge was active in organizing Presidential inaugurations, as well as the Chapter organizing the Presidential Balls.








"No throttle this time =(" says Colette Nichols. "Two years ago this April, I took on one of the greatest and most fulfilling challenges of my life. I learned to ride a motorcycle for the first time after 15 months of chemo for metastatic breast cancer. So I figure its time for the next challenge. I am trading in my bike with a throttle for one with pedals. She's quick to add,

"Don't worry, its not for good!"

On Oct 1 of this year, Nichols plans to ride in the Young Survival Coalition, *Tour de Pink*, a four day, 220 mile bike (that's bike – as in bicycle – not motorcycle) ride for breast cancer. "It's a huge challenge, but I know that I can do it!"

The purpose of the ride is to raise funds to support Young Survival Coalition, the premier non-profit organization dedicated to providing support and education to young women affected by breast cancer. With the motto "Ride. Support. Inspire", the YSC Tour de Pink is much more than just a ride, it's a chance to honor survivors, raise awareness and support important programs for young women with breast cancer.

Nichols became a member of Women of The Moose, Essex Chapter 783 in May of 2008. The members of the Chapter, Essex Lodge #70 and Maryland, Delaware, DC State Association assisted Colette in raising some of the funds she raised for her first 1,000 mile motorcycle ride from Los Angeles to San Francisco the following September. She has since ridden in a 1,000 mile ride from Brisbane to Sydney in Australia in May 2009, following that with a repeat ride from Los Angeles to San Francisco last October. All of her adventures have been in support of the YSC.

She is eagerly looking forward to the ride and is currently training to be able to physically able to meet her newest challenge. But she needs help in raising the required minimum donations of \$2,500. Contributions will:

- Fund support and education programs for young women affected by breast cancer.
- Help support YSC's mission to ensure no young woman faces breast cancer alone.
- Raise awareness that young women can and do get breast cancer.







My husband and I wanted to take a moment to send a heartfelt "Thank You!" to Mayor Dean and the residents of Nashville! We were so looking forward to visiting your city for the Loyal Order of Moose International Convention from July 1 -7, 2010. We were heartbroken for your loss and watched the News reports in horror when we saw the devastation from the flood that occurred on May 1 & 2. We felt sure that there would be no way that your city would be ready for the thousands of Moose members that had already scheduled to attend in less than 60 days. We were terribly disappointed when we received the cancellation notice from Gaylord Opryland Hotel; but not surprised. We were down right shocked when we received notice from our International Headquarters that they intended to keep the convention in Nashville. You see, I work for a Harley-Davidson dealership and they had already moved their convention, slated for the end of July, to Las Vegas! 


