From the Desk of MD-DE-DC Regional Manager Jim Hale



Message from the Regional Manager -

As we are in the first month of the New Year, I would like to take time to thank each and every one of you for all the services you have volunteered to our Lodges, the Districts, the Fraternity and to me. It would seem at times that we have overwhelming tasks and challenges before us; but if we just take them one at a time, working together, we can manage and we will get the job done.

For the past few years we have been faced with obstacles that we did not have control over. The two biggest factors are our nations economy and the loss of jobs for many of our members. Also during this time, we have seen a very sharp decline in the active membership of our Lodges. But we are not alone! This decline is taking place in all of the lodges across our nation, and that affects our fraternity's overall membership. We have seen sharp increases in our grocery bills, our utility bills and the price at the pump. And, this at a time when many have lost their income, or it has been reduced substantially. Again, we are not alone.

The next question is, "What can we as Moose members do to continually support our Lodges, our fraternity and ourselves in this economy?"

If you are having a hard time paying your dues, just sponsor two members and your next year's dues are free. And remember that now through the end of April, Moose International has waived the \$20 application fee. That's a savings right there for those new members. But, if you really want to be creative, encourage that new prospective member to pay two years dues at one time. (He's already saved \$20.00 of that) When he does that, your Lodge will pay the third year for him.

What does this achieve? First of all it guarantees he will be on the active membership rolls for three years. It also allows you more time to get him active in the Lodge, participating in activities and perhaps even becoming an officer someday. Hopefully, you told him all about the good things we do in our communities, our Mooseheart Campus that provides home and shelter to children in need, our superior educational benefits to kids and our championship Red Rambler Football Team. Perhaps he was interested to learn about Moosehaven that provides secure, worry-free living on our campus in Florida. Wherever his interest is peaked, go into more depth in your conversation.


Once you have those new members, make it your personal responsibility to encourage him to visit the lodge and to bring his family in. Take time to sit with him/family and demonstrate some of the finer things we offer in our lodges. If your lodge sign outside indicates that it is a family center, then by all means it should be just that. Granted, all lodges have the 'bar area' but don't let that be the focus. We do not need to let the economy dictate how we sign new members. Let the economy strengthen our resolve to share our fraternal endeavors with others. We can make this year better than last if we only utilize the energy to complain into energy to campaign.



Moose Lodge delivering boxes of food to needy families

WILLIAMSPORT, Md. — The boxes that Moose Lodge volunteers packed with food on Saturday will get the final touches — turkeys and hams — before they're delivered to needy families on Sunday.

Clint Rawlings, governor of Williamsport Moose Lodge 2462, said 25 families will each get two boxes of food.

The boxes contain a variety of items, including tomato sauce, bread, noodles, tea bags, popcorn and cereal.

Rawlings said about 30 volunteers helped sort and pack food items on Saturday afternoon at the Moose Lodge.

When frozen turkeys and hams are added on Sunday, volunteers will deliver the boxes.

Rawlings said the lodge has been doing the food-box donations for four years.

"We just saw a need in the area, with the economy the way it's going," he said.


Many families have little money left for groceries after making their rent or mortgage payments, he said.

The lodge spent more than \$1,900 on dry food items, plus the turkeys and hams.


Westminster Chapter #897's Gem

Three summers ago, a young lady in our community, who attends Cab Calloway School of the Arts, auditioned for a program. She was accepted but scholarship money was not available at that time. In her words "my family isn't poor but they are not rich either, to send me would have put a strain on our finances." Newark Lodge came up with the money to send her to this program. She gives freely of her time and talent to entertain those who are in assisted living and nursing homes, other community events and fund raisers. She received an award for her community service and most hours donated in her school. Award was presented by Governor Markell. So maybe you don't always know the outcome, this time you do. She has potential employment in her field of choice thanks to a an association who believes in assisting the development our youth and to generous members who wanted to assist a young lady to "make a dream come true". 
Women's Official Visitor Verna M. Miller





Meet Me in the Stairwell

You say you will never forget where you were when you heard the news On September 11, 2001.

Neither will I.

I was on the 110th floor in a smoke filled room with a man who called his wife to say 'Good-Bye.'

I held his fingers steady as he dialed. I gave him the peace to say, 'Honey, I am not going to make it, but it is OK..I am ready to go.'

I was with his wife when he called as she fed breakfast to their children. I held her up as she tried to understand his words and as she realized he wasn't coming home that night.

I was in the stairwell of the 23rd floor when a woman cried out to Me for help. 'I have been knocking on the door of your heart for 50 years!' I said. 'Of course I will show you the way home - only believe in Me now.'

I was at the base of the building with the Priest ministering to the injured and devastated souls. I took him home to tend to his Flock in Heaven. He heard my voice and answered.

I was on all four of those planes, in every seat, with every prayer. I was with the crew as they were overtaken. I was in the very hearts of the believers there, comforting and assuring them that their faith has saved them.

I was in Texas, Virginia, California, Michigan,
Afghanistan standing next to you
when you heard the terrible news.
Did you sense Me?

I want you to know that I saw every face. I knew every name - though not all knew Me. Some met Me for the first time on the 86th floor.

Some sought Me with their last breath.

Some couldn't hear Me calling to them through the smoke and flames; 'Come to Me... this way... take my hand.' Some chose, for the final time, to ignore Me.

But, I was there.

I did not place you in the Tower that day. You may not know why, but I do. However, if you were there in that explosive moment in time, would you have reached for Me?

Sept. 11, 2001, was not the end of the journey for you. But someday your journey will end.

And I will be there for you as well.

Seek Me now while I may be found.

Then, at any moment, you know you are 'ready to go.'

I will be in the stairwell of your final moments.
