From the Desk of MD-DE-DC Regional Manager Jim Hale



By the time you receive and read this, another Membership Year will be history. While we did make some progress, I'm afraid it was not quite enough to put us over the bump in the road. And that's exactly what it was; a bump in the road. While there is nothing we can do to make changes for the last year, we can and should have learned some lessons.

This past year I asked that each District President and Deputy Regional Managers work with their respective lodges in achieving a minimum of 90% reporting each and every month. In the months that this happened, we did achieve

our goals. Too many lodges seemed to think that the first six month of the year, they can just slide by. It doesn't work that way – the first six month of a new Board of Officers should be marked by aggressive membership promotion and retention. They set the standard for the remainder of the year. I have repeatedly stated that the Lodge Officers and the Association Offficers should set goals. Without a goal to strive for, nothing is achieved.

I believe that our biggest hurdle is that the members we bring into the Lodge do not renew their dues the next year. Why? The biggest problem that I see is that our members and our Officers are not telling the story of the Moose. Do our new members know that we have homes at Mooseheart that are designed just like other family homes, only on a larger scale? Our children from broken homes, children of grandparent guardians that can no longer care for them, and young people that may have ended up on the streets. At Mooseheart they receive special mentoring from their schoolteachers and family teachers. They have the opportunity to participate in sport programs, music, ROTC and other like programs and college scholarships. Are our members informed about our Scholarship Program for these students as well as students from our own Lodges? We are unique and we offer unique opportunities for the youth of today, all at no cost to their families.

On the other end of life we offer Moosehaven for our senior members. There they have much the same things, and more, than they ever had before; all without having to worry about the rising cost of utilities and medical bills.

And because we as members have failed to tell our story over and over again, our message is not known. Because of that, Moose International has developed a Campaign entitled "Heard of Moose?" This campaign will debut in Tampa at the International Convention. This is a pilot campaign for what will ultimately be the largest public-education program in the history of the organization. It is designed to raise general awareness of the Moose organization, its endeavor for children and teens in need and for its senior members. Twenty-six Moose facilities within a 50-mile radius of downtown Tampa have been provided with a special 4-by-8 ft. banner carrying the message: "Heard of Moose? Here We Are!"

It gives me pleasure to announce that you can go to the Moose International website at www.mooseintl.org or go to HeardofMoose.org and read all about this program before we ever reach Tampa. Please take the time to check out the website and listen to the stories in the four segmented sections. You will be glad you did.
















News from the District Presidents
