

From the Desk of MD-DE-DC Regional Manager Jim Hale



By the time you read this, the campaign year will have ended and all we can do at this point is to go back over the past year and review what we have done (or haven't done) to attain our goals. To all that have served your Lodges and the Association throughout this past year, I offer my thanks. This Association Board of Officers is made up of Team Players and you are expected to be an active team player. More than ever before, as leaders, we must look for innovative ways to be more efficient, increase revenue and retain membership. Our job is to successfully plan and manage your conferences, board meetings and much more.

This same Team Player mentality is expected of Lodge Officers. For some, this means there are some major plans needed by the new Board of Officers. They need to review what was done, what could have been done better and what was not even addressed.

Holding an office in a lodge comes with responsibilities. Tomorrow morning go in the bathroom and look in the mirror. What do you see? Do you see a team player that is willing to tackle the job at hand; someone that is a problem solver, or a team player who will just sit on the bench for the year.

Membership promotion and membership retention are our two biggest concerns. The first of every month every lodge is faced with members that need to renew his dues. Brother Governor, ask the Lodge Administrator or secretary to print that list and give it to you. Make a copy for every officer and hand out at your first meeting of the month. Their goal is to contact 10 members on that list and then give a report of their findings at the next meeting. Do this at the beginning of every month and you will not be faced with what looks to be an insurmountable challenge at the end of the fiscal year.

The next thing to do is put a calendar for the year out at the very first meeting. Go month by month and start filling it up with activities that you know your members like to participate in. Think outside the box and come up with new activities too. You may be pleasantly surprised and see new faces and more participation. There should not be a month go by without something special being planned. All too often when I look at the newsletters, I see too many vacant dates. Granted, there are many members that visit the lodge just for that 'cold one', but we are a Family Fraternity and family activities is what many of our members want. If you don't have them, they will go where there is. Each officer should be responsible for planning and promoting a minimum of one family activity each month. And, then they should have a 'hands on' approach to it, as well as being in attendance for 'his' event. If you say Karaoke, that is just a 'cop out', because that will happen regardless.





Please, sign members, keep those we have, and get your reports in on time. I am proud of this Association and this Fraternity. And I am extremely proud to serve you as your President.








Please Share Your Recipes

R. Robert Dale Scholarships

The following requirements must be met in order to be eligible for the R. Robert Dale Scholarship.

- Have a father, mother, step-parent, grandparent or legal guardian who is a paid up member of the Moose (Applicant is NOT required to reside in the same household)
- Have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 (C+) or higher on a 4.0 scale

HISTORY OF THE MOOSE INTERNATIONAL R. ROBERT DALE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

R. Robert Dale served as Secretary/Administrator of St. Charles, IL Lodge 1368. He was devoted to the Moose fraternity, its precepts and endeavors. He never married; never became a father. His sister married into a modest degree of wealth, but she never had children either. Following the death of her husband, she and Robert named each other in their wills.

Robert survived her - but only by a few months. Robert Dale died on August 15, 1983, leaving an estate of more than \$2 million, to be divided equally between the Veterans of Foreign Wars National Home and the Loyal Order of Moose, both for the purpose of providing scholarships. In 1985, Director General Paul O'Hollaren and the Supreme Council approved a program in which the interest from the Dale Scholarship Fund was to be used to provide scholarships for sons and daughters of Moose members who had graduated from high school, to further their higher education, and the R. Robert Dale Scholarship Program was created.

Some 1,232 Dale Scholarships - totally \$1,232,000 - have been awarded since the R. Robert Dale Scholarship Program began, with the graduating Class of 1987.

Applicants for the program must be high-school juniors with a grade-point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale. They are eligible only if their father, mother, step-parent, grandparent or legal guardian is a member of the Moose in good standing.

The number of scholarships awarded to each State and Provincial Moose Association, is computed based on the current membership of the Association and scholarship application submitted. This determines whether or not they hold an independent drawing during their Association convention. If the Association does not qualify for its own drawing, an at-large drawing is held at Moose International. Any individual Moose Lodge and its Chapter submitting 20 or more eligible applications qualifies for a bonus scholarship to be drawn from among just their applicants.

The Scholarship may be used for tuition, books, and fees at any accredited vocational or academic institution the winner chooses to attend.





Thanks to everyone for helping to make this a great year for me and our Association. Until we meet again.





How easier things could have been this past year if we had been in possession of those chairpersons names and e-mails. Please make sure I have those contacts.



This has been a long hard road lot of time, travel, and effort but we now have a bill, ready to present, hopefully this week. It will not go to the house first; this will be presented to the senate. Please call all your representatives and request they vote favorably. There were

some concerns about the connecting to the central lottery office. The representatives from the governor's office learned early on the venders for the casinos we not interested in being our vender, it would have cost the state more money and it would have taken tax payers money to fund the project. They agreed to go back to Delaware vendors in the bill it states by 2014 we must be connected. I called and spoke to the deputy chief of staff who has been working with us. He assures me they believe they have found a solution and we will keep our same machines and venders without incident.

One of the most helpful items in this overall situation was the forming of the coalition. Alone each Nonprofit could have presented their information and request for favorable legislation; they would have been able to keep shuffling and would have accomplished little or nothing. This could have been dragged out for years. Forming our coalition gave us a united front and common cause it's much harder to ignore thousands than it is to shuffle 14,000. Together we were able to accomplish in getting these machines on and now to have them legitimate in less than a year. I would implore everyone everywhere to become acquainted to the other non-profits in your area, form that bond you never know when it will be needed. Hopefully we can get together with those in Maryland after dealing with Delaware government we find they have been commiserating with Maryland and agree on many issues about these machines, Maryland needs to be ready for some changes.

Once more thank everyone for all their help and co-operation without that it would have made this road a lot bumpier. It is not Government relations but thank everyone for all their calls and concerns and prayers for Calvin, things are looking a little better.
