From the Desk of Ed Thompson, Regional Mgr.

Since the Mid-Year Conference some of the information shared during the conference has changed. The King of Hearts is extended through the end of this fiscal year (April 30, 2015). As you know, all members who sponsor a new or former member by April 30th will receive a credit to play the game for each individual they sponsor. Although the sponsorship period ends on April 30th, they will have the ability to go online and play the game through May 10th. To date, nearly 1,000 members have played and over \$6,000 in promotional prizes have been distributed.

By now each lodge received information pertaining to \$0 application fee being waived beginning March 1 through April 30, 2015. The Supreme Council authorized the General Governor to issue a blanket dispensation to waive all application fees in March and April. It is the Membership Department thought that the \$0 Application Fee will provide momentum for the lodges as they move into the new-year on a positive note. No fees will be collected or billed, meaning Moose International will waive the \$10 it has been collecting throughout this year, and the lodges will no longer collect \$10 that they have been retaining for membership campaign purpos-



es. No application fees will apply to lodges, chapters and Moose Legions. This may be the last time the fees will be waived with the new member incentives that will be offered. The new incentives are being developed and will be communicated once the development is complete.

The Lodge Grant Application and Award Process has changed for 2015-16. The application process for the 2015-16 Supreme Council Lodge Grant Program will open on May 1st, 2015 and close on June 30th, 2015, using the same electronic format in the Admin Menu accessed through the Moose International website as was used last year.

Note: Despite the earlier time frame for applications, attendance at the 2015 International Moose Convention in Nashville, TN will still be required for grant consideration.

When the application process closes at the end of June, attendance records for the 2015 International Convention will be verified. Territory Managers will be notified of the lodges in their area that have met all qualifications and will be given the rest of July to make any visits or verifications of proposed projects. They will then be asked to rank the lodges within their territories and the Regional Managers will have access next to provide further rankings for the region. The second week of August, Regional rankings should be available for Moose International's staff to review and make final recommendations to the Supreme Council, which will approve all final grants during the third or fourth week in August. Grant work can begin as early as September 1st to allow work be done before the winter cold sets in. All projects will have until April 30th to be completed. Information will be sent to all lodges within the next few weeks on how to apply and any changes that may have been made to the process in addition to those noted above.

I encourage all lodges to take advantage of the \$0 application fee to increase their lodge active membership. Remember, the goal is for each lodge to have "Plus 1" on April 30, 2015 and to achieve at minimum a retention rate of 80%. Take advantage of this incentive.

I want to thank all for making the recent Mid-Year Conference a success. The lodge participation was great and everyone contributing did an excellent job. I look forward to the August Convention.

We are nearing the completion of our fiscal year. Being that we have approximately one month and one-half remaining in this fiscal year, each Lodge officer needs to spend this period of time going over records of membership, events, and service projects within

our communities. We need to compare what we have done with the criteria of the individual Lodge and personnel awards that we could be entitled to be receiving in the form of honors and recognition. Have we met the requirements for the Five Star Program, Premier Lodge Award, and the various additional awards designed for the Lodge, Administrators, and Governors - just to name a few? What individual criteria line item have we overlooked that can be worked on to enable for us to be qualified? So, do not wait until the last moment as we are so accustomed to doing!

As you have heard, our Association, as well as other Associations, is having a very difficult time in maintaining our membership base, recruiting new members, and retaining existing members. It has been a disappointing year for our Lodges, Districts, Association, and Moose International. Currently, to help us to finish out the year and to help our Lodges to meet their membership goals, Moose International has extended the King of Hearts program and has dropped the application fee from March 01, 2015 through and including April 30, 2015. Use these and your Lodge short term membership programs to your advantage so that your Lodge can meet its membership goal.

The following message was used in a Lodge newsletter and has appeared in other service organization's magazines/newsletter. Please read it as it does make a lot of sense and brings the truth to home!

Ten Ways to Kill a Lodge:

- 1. Don't go to the meetings.
- 2. If you do go, go late.
- 3. If the weather does not suit you, do not think of going.
- 4. If you do attend a meeting, find faults with the work of the officers and members.
- 5. Never accept an office as it is easier to criticize than to do things.
- 6. Get sore if you are not appointed on a committee, but if you are, do not attend committee meetings.
- 7. If asked by the officers to give your opinion on some matter, tell them you have nothing to say. After the meeting, tell everyone at the bar how things should be done.
- 8. Do nothing more than absolutely necessary, but when members use their ability to help matters along, howl that the Lodge is run by a clique.
- 9. Hold back your dues or just do not pay at all.
- 10. Do not bother about getting new members, "Let George do it."

It is a shame, however, there is a whole lot of truth to the above message. Let's all work together as a team so that we do not kill our Lodge.



If I can do anything to help anyone, please don't hesitate to contact me.








Happenings in Williamsport

I need your help badly - we are under 60,000 Moose Legionnaires. Active Moose Legion membership is currently down over 2,600 members. We started the year with 59,295 active members. As of this morning, AED looks like this:

But look at the opportunities we have in just the expired column! Over 7,000 opportunities to recover members who have let their dues lapse. Some of them simply need a friendly reminder.

Two months left and International has dropped the enrollment fee, only need to pay whatever the dues are in each Moose Legion. Each of us can make a difference.

Government Relations Message by Association Coordinator Bessie Staab-Hickman

Wow, this has been a real rough winter! Be so glad to see sunshine for more than one day at the time above freezing. So very sorry I could not make mid-winter. The extra information could have made things a little easier for the Lottery yearend report. AT THE RISK OF SAYING "THIS IS A RECORDING" IT IS. The state is not playing games they want their monthly manual reports in on time, and they definitely want this year-end report on time. Remember they hold the key our gaming machines and licenses. We are currently searching for solutions which will probably



mean we have to go back to our legislators for a permanent resolution. This is not a problem of our making but it is a problem that must be fixed. Your government relations reps have spent many hours on the road, phone, e-mail and meetings. Cannot thank those lodges who gave of their time, invited legislators, and gave us the opportunity to show them we are responsible, have safeguards in place for double check and accountable. WE must impress gaming is not our business, we are not casinos, these machines are a TOOL to assist us in what we do best "People Helping People". Currently we are asking support from them to add an amendment to allow us to keep our venders. We want the wording changed from "Connected to central" to "controlled by". Have one or two of those in place, need more set from New Castle County. We will be asking help from everyone to reach this goal.

Does anyone really believe this Government program is unnecessary? Last year alone in Delaware there were 35 bills introduced that had tag-along that could have been harmful to the non-profits. We're still watching for a revision 187. The non-profits are slowly but surely being regulated into oblivion. I really don't believe most people know NON_PROFITS CAN"T MAKE MONEY< WE DO PAY TAXES. We need to have folks in place that will meet greet and spread the word about who we are what we do and how to proceed. In my opinion this should be included in our training sessions. Many say" I would but I don't know how."

Examples:

Our kitchens are inspected, and licensed, added to this as of May one person either from Lodge or Chapter must pay a fee take an approved course to be certified. Why? Another license? In a way it's the state getting income. Have to mark any baked /soup sale goods that it came from your kiitchen, not from an inspected one or you can be fined. Reason for another permit? The list keeps growing. Queen of Hearts game requires a \$15.00 a week permit until game is finished, as are others, check before you start any game. 





We can do it – When we all work together!


