



Membership Retention

MD/DE/DC Moose Association—Life membership Campaign

All Lodges and Chapters within the MD, DE and DC Moose Association, we need to embrace this idea so we can not only strengthen our Moose units but bring our Beloved One Moose Fraternity together (LOOM / WOTM) working as one unit for the greater good of our Lodges and Chapters. Going forward after May 2021 we will be a one Moose Lodge, a Chapter (or whatever the name will be) and Moose Legion.

We have seen that Frederick Chapter of the WOTM has a Lifetime Membership campaign running, this is an awesome deal not only for the chapter but also, for the Lodges as well for the future of our beloved Moose Fraternity. Any member that purchases a Lifetime membership assures our units of a member for life, obviously. It also, shows a commitment to the organization and going forward it may incite that individual to be involved more, either being an officer or chairman or just supporting the lodge in their endeavors in supporting our cause or maybe they have greater things in mind. They may like to take office on the Lodge, Chapter, Moose Legion, District or Association Levels. At all levels we need to encourage this momentum that Frederick Chapter has initiated and grow and expand on that.

To expand on this campaign, we propose that the lodges and chapters run a similar campaign. Possibly, have the Lodge and Chapter contribute, equally to the discounted amount. As an example; both Lodge and Chapter could contribute 25 % of the total and then the member would be responsible for the remaining balances. The women would benefit in the short term as they will be getting the ABCD (per capita) back from each lifetime membership that is received by Moose International which would offset the discount, and the LOOM will benefit with a member who will not be lost after we become One Moose in May 2021. Coworkers that are already Life members of the WOTM will become Life members of the Lodges, and forever be on the rolls (retention). A "WIN-WIN" for both the Lodges and Chapters. Not, being a negative Nelly, but we know that when this One Moose becomes history, we are going to have WOTM that will not renew their dues because the have no interest in the extra dues or just cannot afford the additional cost. In addition, some will just say why do I want to pay dues when I can come in as a guest of my spouse. It appears that the Women currently pay from \$25.00 and up to renew annually. Under the One Moose they will be paying the Lodge Dues of approximately \$40.00 or more and after 3 years an additional \$15.00 to remain a Chapter Member. That is over double what they were paying. The Women of the Moose support the Lodges in many ways and for the Lodges it is imperative to have the Chapters in place to help with costs and contribute to the future of the fraternity. We all know that "The Women can get it done". I believe we owe it to our members and our fraternity to protect these memberships however we can. Remember coworkers, once you have your Life Membership in the Chapter you will be a life member of the Lodge under the One Moose in May 2021 and you will also benefit from the fact that your Lifetime Membership will also include the chapter dues, so no additional dues will be required. There may also be a way that Lodges can do the same and possibly offer a similar campaign. I do not suggest the chapters offer the same additional discounts to share with the lodges as the chapter funds may not support that offer, but if the chapters would have the funds and would like to offer it would be a welcomed bonus. You could possibly establish a fundraiser to help offset the cost for these discounts, however, the lodge will also receive the ABCD per capita from each Member that can offset the discounts too.

I know there are times when we have conflicts on the Lodge and Chapter Levels with agreements on the exact way to handle things, but this is for the greater good of Your Fraternity and we are ONE Moose and we can do this ... "It's What We Do, We're Moose" ... Bruce Berger.

The Lodge would need to write a check for their portion to the chapter, as well as the member would need to write a check to the chapter for the remaining balance and then the Chapter would submit one check to Moose International with the members information. 


Enter to Learn

Robert "Bob" Zaininger and his twin brother Dick were 5-years-old when they lost their father and came to Mooseheart in 1951. After a two-year stay, the boys returned home to be with their mother. In 1960, following the death of their mother, the pair returned to Mooseheart. Bob and his brother Dick graduated in 1965 and the pair were named by their class as "most likeable." Bob graduated from Lakeland University in Plymouth, WI, where he excelled as both a student and athlete. He was inducted into the Lakeland University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2016. Bob returned to Mooseheart, where he taught and

coached football and wrestling. Bob married his college sweetheart Gaye

in 1970. The couple settled in Aurora, IL where they raised a son and daughter. As Mooseheart's first Recreation Director, he created programs for children of all ages that offered opportunities for field trips and many on-campus activities. Bob later served Mooseheart as Assistant Superintendent of Mooseheart for 11 years. In 2005, he was honored as a Distinguished Mooseheart alumni and was inducted into the Mooseheart Athletic Hall of Fame. Bob was the Museum of Moose History curator from 2006-2015. He died peacefully at home in November, 2019. In the words of Mooseheart Executive Director and 1987 Mooseheart graduate Gary Urwiler, "Bob Zaininger was a man that many students looked up to. He provided activities that were fun and memorable to this day. I admired his passion for Mooseheart and especially the kids. I will never forget Mr. Zaininger playing walking tackle football with us and bringing a busload of Mooseheart kids to my last two college football games in Missouri and Kentucky." Bob was perhaps best described in a reference letter from 1968 by then-Superintendent of Mooseheart Walter Ketz, who referred to Robert A. Zaininger as an "Exceptional young man and a devoted student. He has a magnetic personality, is an excellent athlete, and to our knowledge has no bad habits of any type. He is the kind of young man this nation needs at this moment."

He certainly was the kind of man Mooseheart needed.

5 Star Award News

Delaware gaming has gotten its computer up and running so you may apply for any and all legal gaming on line. The first application is a lot of paperwork but afterwards it's easy. Go to Delaware professional Gaming, then to gaming for non-profits, there are plenty of instructions there. I firmly suggest before starting any new game to check and determine if you require a license. Asked about a game actually a game formerly known as Bar Bingo, (no drinking when you are playing bingo) so it required a name change,
