The Campaign began early November and a substantial quantity of toys, games, and activity books for the children to enjoy were collected.






ONE MOOSE

From the days of wearing a fez emblazoned with the iconic "Women of the Moose Legion" red heart and wearing evening gowns to meetings — we certainly have "...come a long way baby!".

As we stand on the precipice of a new dawn for our fraternity, we follow in the pioneering footsteps of the Washington State Northern Idaho Moose Association which voted last year to include WOTM into their Moose Association.

Several of our members traveled to the November 1, 2019 ONE MOOSE TOWN HALL held in Orlando Florida. Chuck & Jean Neal, Lillian & Michael Shawver, Leo Custer and Jerry Hayman all made the trek. We heard many well thought out questions from the hundreds of Moose members in attendance. The PowerPoints and information given by the leaders of our fraternity and the One Moose Committee were most insightful. Our members, nationwide, have all been afforded the opportunity to participate in a "straw vote" to indicate their preference to include women in the Loyal Order of Moose Lodges. Thus far, it has been overwhelmingly in favor of Women joining the LOOM.

There was quite a bit of information given at the town hall meeting that I couldn't possibly do justice to in this publication. However, I will share a few of the most prevalent concerns below:

1) Would the Chapters remain in existence?

In short, yes—the chapters will continue to operate.

The best way that I understand the new structure would be to liken the Chapters to the Moose Legion. You have to be a Moose Legion member in order to progress and attain higher degrees. Same for the Chapter—In order to attain higher degrees, you would have to belong to a Chapter. For those of us who currently hold higher degrees, in order to retain them you must continue to belong to a chapter. The officer staffing, meeting requirements and nomenclature will change slightly.

- 2) What would happen to Chapter funds?
 - The Chapter will retain all of their funds and will not now, nor in the future be required to turn part or any Chapter funds over to the Lodge.
- 3) How would the higher degrees already attained by our WOTM translate to the LOOM?

 All degrees will remain intact as long as the member remains a member in a chapter. Just as it is now, any member wishing to pursue higher degrees must continue to work within their chapter toward successful completion of yearly goals in order to qualify for higher degrees.
- 4) How will general membership and life membership be addressed?

Provided the ONE MOOSE vote is favorable, LOOM and WOTM members will be known as MOOSE members as of May 1, 2021. LOOM and WOTM will no longer be used. All MOOSE members will pay Lodge dues plus the dues for either Moose Legion <u>or</u> Chapter with which they're affiliated. (i.e: for MALE Moose: Lodge + Moose Legion dues, for FEMALE Moose: Lodge + Chapter dues.)

To help defray the additional cost of dues, WOTM members holding annually renewable membership on April 30, 2021 will not have to pay Chapter dues for three years so they'd only owe the yearly Lodge dues until 2024 at which time they'll begin paying both Lodge and Chapter dues. Female MOOSE joining May 1,2021 or after, would immediately begin paying Lodge dues. If /when they join the Chapter they'd pay Chapter dues as well.

If a WOTM holds a life membership before 4/30/2021 she will automatically convert to a Life Membership in Lodge <u>AND</u> Chapter. So it seems it would behoove current members to consider purchasing a Lifetime membership in accordance with the pricing scale introduced at the Int'l Convention last June. They are also looking into a 'Family Membership' rate.

However, keep in mind that all of this is fluid while they work through the intricacies of bringing several entities which all have their own IRS presence under one umbrella.

Be sure to attend the Mid Year Conference and attend Joint Session 2 on Friday, March 6 at 1:30 where TM Mike Stumbaugh will offer a more comprehensive report on ONE MOOSE. You may also keep abreast of information by accessing the ONE MOOSE videos on You Tube.



I sincerely wish everyone had a great Holiday Season with family and friends, and this New Year brings the best of everything to you.

That being said I am convinced we have two new national flowers, the orange and white barrels and cones and the yellow signs along the roadways. I know there is not a road in ours or surrounding states that does not have a chunk out of it or widening and/or yellow signs plaster all over it. If they are anywhere near your lodge or home, better take the time even if it's taking your life in your hands to read the fine print in that little white square (bottom in the right



hand corner). These signs are usually on the highway with little or no parking, in a field or even on a tree, Who knows there could be a very unfriendly bull in that field. Why take a chance? If you care about your lodge you will take the chance to read that little white box. It is vital information, it will tell you what the plans are for the property under development or study, where the meetings will be held for said study, when the meetings will held and time. This is usually the only notice that will be given. Occasionally, you will find them in the back of a newspaper or one of your local flyers. We have too many developments going up and road widening to ignore these signs. This is a federal law Eminent Domain all they have to do is posts that sign if you do not attend the meetings you have agreed. Once passed there is little and in most cases nothing you can do. So you could lose property. Same with zoning, many times it's posted in for your usual monthly meeting agendas for town, county or parish. If you do not show to protest or in some cases ask to be grandfathered, you could wind up with a gas station on your doorstep or in your backyard. Folks this is only one or two reasons why we need chairpersons in every lodge and chapter.

We need to be sure we have the "members and guests only" on our marquees, unless that is stated on your sign the IRS can say you are open to the public. It has happened so please be aware. We have to be sure we are playing any games correctly and be aware if there are any changes in those regulations, so you need to touch base with the Professional Gaming for Charitable Organizations. They sometimes allow new games or change the rules or regulations of old games. They always have Inspectors out checking. Take nothing for granted better to be safe than pay a fine or lose a license. You can access this on line and check yourself, again the meeting agendas usually state what is being discussed and minutes of previous meetings posted. 



Some other ways that sponsors support their children at Mooseheart include:


- Proudly display photographs and correspondence with their child at the local Lodge or Chapter and share them with their members.






